Call Allowed Sixth District Residents to Participate in a Town Hall from Home

WASHINGTON, DC - Congressman Don Cazayoux held his second Telephone Town Hall, or "Tele-Town Hall," last night. Calls went out to 6th District households at approximately 6:30 p.m. central, giving constituents the opportunity to participate in a town hall from their own homes.

"Once again, the Tele-Town Hall proved to be a great tool for reaching out to my constituents," Congressman Cazayoux said. "Even though I'm in Washington, I'm still just a phone call away from the district. I want to thank those who participated and asked questions in the town hall."

Congressman Cazayoux began the call by updating listeners on what has happened over the last several weeks in Congress and was able to answer questions about the rising price of gasoline, the new GI Bill, health care, and what services his office can provide to the 6th District.

Over 4,700 stayed for part of the call and 80 people had questions for the Congressman. 220 people chose to participate in a quick survey, which asked what they thought Congress's top priority should be.

"I pride myself on being accessible to the people of my district, and Tele-Town Halls are an innovative way to reach out," Cazayoux said. "As Congress addresses important issues in the coming months such as the price of gas, supporting our troops and veterans, and lowering the cost of health care for seniors and children, it is essential that I hear from my constituents on these issues."
